“The Queen’s Green Canopy’ is a nation-wide tree planting initiative created to mark the Platinum Jubilee. Re-Betchworth’s ambition is to have at least 70 trees planted in gardens across the village by March 2023. The Parish Council is offering a number of £30 vouchers to subsidise young container-grown tree purchase at Knights Garden Centre.
